Around our School

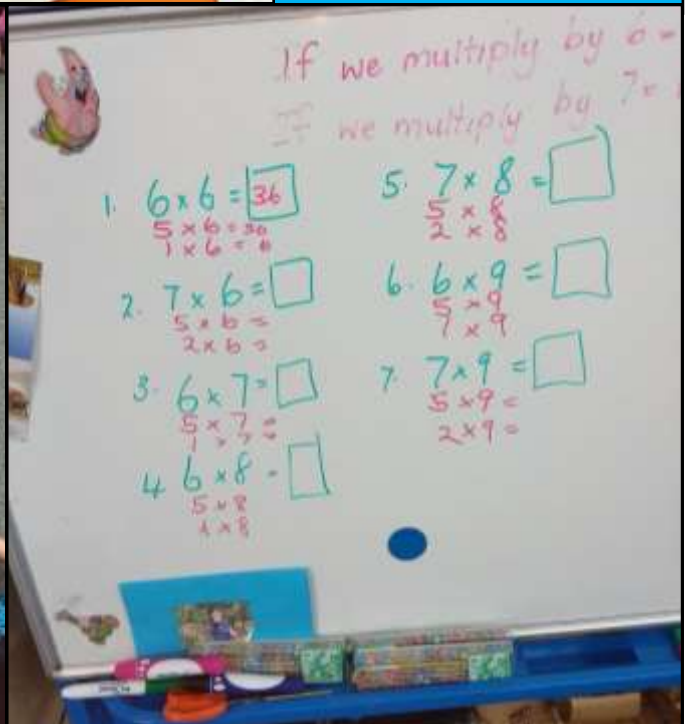

Strep Throat Fact Sheet - We have Strep Throat at WVS

Strep throat is an infection caused by bacteria called Group A Streptococcus (sometimes just called "Strep").

Strep throat can occur at any age, but is most frequent among school-aged children.

Symptoms start 1 to 5 days after exposure and include:

Fever Sore throat Tender and swollen neck glands

Sometimes people with Strep can develop a red rash all over the body that feels like sandpaper. When this occurs, the illness is called "scarlet fever."

People can also harbor Strep bacteria in their throats but not feel sick at all (they are called "carriers").

Strep bacteria are spread through direct contact with mucus from the nose or throat of infected persons or through the air by sneezing or coughing.

People with Strep throat can spread Strep bacteria to others until 24 hours after antibiotic treatment or for 10 to 21 days if untreated.

Strep throat can be diagnosed by a doctor using a routine throat swab.

Strep throat can be treated with antibiotics. Treatment is important to prevent serious complications such as rheumatic fever. Infected children should be excluded from school until 24 hours after starting treatment. Strep throat can be prevented through these precautions:

- Cover the mouth when coughing or sneezing
- Wash hands before preparing food
- Wash hands after wiping or blowing nose, coughing, and sneezing
- See your doctor if you or your child have symptoms of strep throat

Signs and Symptoms of Strep Throat






Usually include:

- Sore throat starts quickly
- Pain when swallowing
- Fever
- Red and swollen tonsils, sometimes with white patches or streaks of pus
- Tiny red spots on the roof of the mouth
- Swollen lymph nodes in the front of the neck

Typically do not include:

- Cough
- Runny nose
- Hoarseness
- Conjunctivitis (pink eye)
