CORONAVIRUS / COVID-19 - Current information for WVS:

We are receiving daily updates from the Ministry of Health and the Ministry of Education to advise us of any precautions and new information as it arises that may be relevant to schools. To date, none of the information has directly related to Waikite Valley School students. We have decided to request our Japanese Farm Stay students not attend our school during their visit in March/April, which saddens us due to the learning we gain from inviting these children into our classes, but we are cognizant that we have a responsibility towards minimizing the risk to our community.

The Ministry of Education has referred us to further facts from the World Health Organization.

- Evidence from China shows that only 1% of reported cases do not have symptoms, and most of those cases develop symptoms within 2 days.
- Young people 18 years and under represent less than 2.4 per cent of those who have contracted the virus.
- From the data we have so far, COVID-19 does not transmit as efficiently as influenza.

It continues to remain that the best thing to do is to practice good preventative measures, particularly good hygiene:

- Washing hands with soap and water for 20 seconds before & after eating, as well as after attending the toilet
- Covering coughs and sneezes with clean tissues or with an elbow
- Putting used tissues in the bin
- Encouraging staff and students to stay home if they are unwell

If any new, relevant information comes to hand I will inform you via the school Facebook page, newsletter and website. By and large, it is business as usual for us, with more attention being paid to good hygiene and encouraging personal responsibility. There are recipes online (that are fun learning and inexpensive) for hand sanitizers if you are interested. Please talk with your children about flushing the toilet, washing their hands, sneezing and coughing into their elbows or a clean tissue.

History of Ngati Tahu-Ngati Whaoa people

Our people have occupied these lands since the arrival of our Tupuna Ariki Tahu Mataa. Tahu arrived here before the arrival of the seven waka from Hawaii. Our Tupuna Whaoa arrived here some generations younger. We have asserted and maintained mana whenua and mana whakahaere through continued ahi karoa (occupation) and possession of our lands and taonga. Prior to the arrival of European settlers to Aotearoa, Ngati Tahu-Ngati Whaoa was an autonomous, independent and self governing confederation of 8 hapu. In more recent times the descendants of our many tupuna have operated as a single tribal grouping known today as Ngati Tahu-Ngati Whaoa.
