

Matariki is a time for feasting and sharing the harvest with whānau and hapū. Matariki feasts often feature food that is cooked in a hāngi.


The Hākari that we will be preparing this Wednesday will have the following food:

- Tupu-ā-rangi = tree food: **turkey, chicken**
- Waitī = freshwater food: eel, trout
- Waitā = salt water/ocean food: snapper
- Tupu-ā-nuku = food from the land: **potatoes, kumara, mutton, venison, pumpkin, carrots, cabbage, parnsips**

As part of our celebration, the students will also take part in reflecting on:

- Hiwa-i-te-rangi = our future, wishes, goals and dreams for the year ahead
- Pohutukawa = remembering and celebrating those who have passed

We plan to lift the hangi and feast at 1pm - anyone who is able to come along for the day is most welcome! The fire will be lit about 5.30am - baskets put down around 9am.
