There are some important messages in this newsletter; I encourage you to take a few moments to read them carefully.

Student Categories	Student with	Equivalent to
Regular attendance	over 90% attendance	missing fewer than 5 days across a term
Irregular absence	more than 80% and up to 90% attendance	absent for between 5 and 9 days across a term
Moderate absence	more than 70% and up to 80% attendance	absent for between 10 and 14.5 days across a term
Chronic absence	70% attendance or less	absent for 15 days or more across a school term

#### Updates on Reporting to Parents and Wh<mark>a</mark>nau

In Week 9, you will receive your child/ren's mid-year reports via email. Please make sure the school office has your most up-to-date contact information. <u>office@waikitevalley.school.nz</u>

The rules around reporting to parents and wh  $_{\bar{a}}$  nau haven't changed. Schools still need to report to students and their families **at least twice a year**. These reports will show how your child is doing and how they're progressing across the curriculum, especially in **literacy and maths**.

What's new is that schools now need to show progress based on the **updated English (Years 0-6)** and **Maths & Statistics (Years 0-8)** learning areas. Please bear in mind that at this point in the year, the curriculum hasn't been fully covered.

For Years 7 and 8, we have decided to use the **draft refreshed English curriculum** to report progress. This helps us get ready for future changes and gives us a clear picture of how our learners are developing.

#### Statement from the Ministry of Education to Support Schools with Reporting to Parents

As part of our focus on lifting student achievement we have introduced new, knowledge-rich and internationally–comparable curriculum this year for Maths in Years 0–8 and English in Years 0–6, and Te Reo Rangatira Years 0-6 and Pāngarau Years 0-8 wāhanga ako.

This means we are currently changing from the old to the new curriculum. We want to acknowledge that schools and kura will only have been using the new curricula from the start of 2025, which includes new teaching and assessment methods and content.

Because of this you could see a change in your child's progress or achievement compared to previous years which may be the result of changes in the curriculum expectations for your child's year level. If you have concerns or questions about your child's achievement, we strongly suggest you talk with your child's teacher or kaiako. They will also have used their own observations, classroom tasks and other tests to report on the progress your child is making.
